Measles Rubella vaccination campaign is re-scheduled to be held in West Bengal from 9<sup>th</sup> January, 2023 to 11<sup>th</sup> February 2023 (except Darjeeling GTA area and Kalimpong, where it will start from 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2023 and it will be end on 18<sup>th</sup> March, 2023).

They are also requested to peruse memo No.308(3)-Secy (HFW)/2022 dated 11/11/2022 of Department of Health & Family Welfare, Government of West Bengal (Copy enclosed) and actively participate & support and keep coordination with all the concerned offices / officers in the Circle / Block / District level to make it grand success.

Sub: - Measles Rubella Campaign of West Bengal.

Sir,

You are aware that Measles is one of the major causes of childhood mortality and morbidity in India. Rubella infection in pregnant women disables a child for life with Congenital Rubella Syndrome that may result in deafness, blindness and heart defects. Our country is committed to eliminate Measles and control Rubella /Congenital Rubella Syndrome.

As part of the key elimination strategy, Measles Rubella vaccination campaign is re-scheduled to be held in West Bengal from 9th January 2023 to 11th February 2023 (except Darjeeling GTA area and Kalimpong, where it will start from 15th February 2023 and will end on 18th March 2023). A successful campaign will involve vaccination of all children of age group 9 months to less than 15 years in all districts and urban areas of the state, and the state government is fully committed to do so. The campaign will be initially school based, followed by community based. Hence active participation and cooperation of Tribal Development, BCW and MAME at every level is highly required for successful implementation of the program.

In this regard I will like to have support of your department on following aspects -

1. Plan and conduct MR vaccination session sites along with the their health counterpart in:
  - Madrassas and minority educational institutions
  - Ekalavya Model Schools/ other tribal schools (including hostels) for immunizing all target eligible children during MR vaccination campaign.
2. Organize orientation meetings with local Influential persons and institutions to ensure their involvement in mobilizing their children for MR vaccination.

Necessary direction from your end may kindly be issued to the concerned officers for their active participation and support.
