The petitioner has filed a Photostat copy of Resolution dated 24.11.2018 wherefrom, it is crystal clear that recruitment rules being no. 486-MD/O/2M-11/2016 dated 03.03.2016 have not been complied with in the alleged recruitment of the petitioner. The petitioner had no requisite qualification to be appointed as Assistant Teacher of History (Pass). The petitioner himself admitted that he did not appear in any written examination or before an Interview Board for being recruited as Assistant Teacher. The petitioner stopped visiting the Madrasah on and from 20.03.2020.

The Headmaster and D.I. of Schools have also stated that the petitioner was never recruited following the rules of recruitment being 486-MD/O/2M-11/2016 dated 03.03.2016 and no intimation was given to the State of West Bengal at the time of alleged recruitment of the petitioner in terms of Sec-4(1) of The West Bengal Schools (control of expenditure) Act 2005.

The previous Teacher-in-Charge, Manjuara Khatun (worked as Teacher-in-Charge from 01.05.2012 to 29.12.2021) specifically stated that the Petitioner was never appointed following the rules of recruitment and there was no Resolution adopted by the Managing Committee for the recruitment of the petitioner. She has also submitted a declaration to that effect under her own handwriting and signature.

In absence of any valid Resolution of the Managing Committee, to show that recruitment rules were strictly followed in the alleged recruitment of the petitioner and the signature of the petition in the official Attendance Register, we are of the considered view that the petitioner was never recruited following the rules of recruitment being no. 486-MD/O/2M-11/2016 dated 03.03.2016 and he never worked in the Madrasah.
